A Note from the Associate Pastor's Desk

"Back to school"-time always makes me reflect on the teachers, administrators, and other student friends I've experienced over the many years. From my very early days at St. Ethelreda to St

Christopher, from Marist High School to Lewis University, and eventually off to the University of St. Mary of the Lake Seminary – there have been numerous women and men who took up the task to educate and form me and so many others.

One of the most interesting pieces to my education has a connection to St. Cletus. My first-grade teacher at St. Ethelreda in Chicago, Ruth Ann Derbas, would eventually go on to become the principal of St. Cletus in the mid-1980s. That is a fact I would have never even dreamt of had I not taken the time to talk with a parishioner about two months ago. It was a very random conversation and he brought up her name. It

piqued my interest at once, and so, when I returned to our campus, I went to the school to see if I could find her picture. It was definitely my teacher. As a second oddity to the connection to Ms. Derbas and my life, her sister was the vice principal at my first assignment as a priest at St. George in Tinley Park. Super-small world.

You've heard me refer to my 8th grade teacher at St. Christopher, Jim Schuler.
Like so many other men who have influenced my life, Jim was very intelligent, wise, and had a great sense of humor. He loved the Church too. Both he and one of his brothers nearly became priests before meeting their respective

future wives. That certainly did not make Jim any less of a fan of the Church. He always pushed our class (and others before mine) to keep on advancing in faith. Eventually, as I was off to the seminary, Jim

was one of the primary influences for seeing it through to ordination. Being the main celebrant at his funeral was one of the more difficult things I've ever had to do, but the most privileged too.

Having attended Catholic high school and university, many of my teachers were religious order priests and brothers. I don't really want to single out any one of them as I loved so many of them. I probably should not single out any one professor from the seminary either. But I can say with honesty and conviction, I would not be the person I am today without those many men who showed such care and concern for me. And please don't get me wrong. I've had

my fair share of women religious (mostly Franciscans) who made their mark on me, but it tended to be the brothers and priests who had the most influence.

I am ever-grateful to all of my teachers over time, even the ones I didn't fair so well in their classes with my grades. I'm sure it was not their intention but my less willing attitude to please someone whom I couldn't fully respect them except for the authority they had.

I've had it good. That's an understatement.














XXII Sunday in Ordinary Time - Cycle B

The principle of clean and unclean was at the root of Jewish preoccupation with ritual purification. The Jewish Law had developed definite and rigid rules, not for hygienic cleanliness but for ritual or ceremonial purity.

For example, hands were to be washed before every meal and between courses in a specific manner. To fail in any part of this ritual was to be unclean in the sight of God. For this reason, the Pharisees and Scribes cited the disciples of Jesus for not washing their hands before eating (v. 5).

Jesus, for his part, cut through the "legalese" of his critics and spoke to the very heart of the matter. Purity or holiness would no longer be a matter of soap and water but of a lived faith that responds to God's word and cooperates with God's forgiving, cleansing grace. Quoting the prophet Isaiah (29:13), Jesus called his contemporaries (and us) to move

beyond that hypocrisy that pays lip service but hides a sinful, devious heart behind impeccably washed hands. He rejected the Law since it had succeeded in overshadowing God's commands.

Each one has to discern for themselves just how, in given circumstances, they can best love and serve Christ. It calls for a great deal of honesty, integrity, and a high level of real freedom—the freedom to choose what is good, what is better, and what is more loving. The Gospel is not a code of laws. It provides a vision of a truly human life lived for God among other people. It is focused on relationships rather than individual actions.

We will have many opportunities to love and serve Jesus in various situations. Instead of being anxious about what I may do wrong ("Is it a sin?"), ask instead, "Where and how can I be a more loving, caring and compassionate person?"

Mission Ladies

Thanks, Mateo, for your hard work and commitment to this project. Many people will significantly benefit from your project. Blessings,






