
Notes from Fr. Bob...

16TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

In today's gospel, Martha is so intent on doing everything that any real personal experience of our Lord is missed. At first glance, our sympathies lie with poor Martha as she runs around trying to make sure that the sacred duty of hospitality is fulfilled. So why is Martha criticized, while the apparently selfish, even lazy Mary, is praised by Jesus? Surely Martha is doing no more than Abraham and Sarah in hurrying around to prepare food and drink for the guests? They received a blessing as their reward, and yet the Lord criticizes Martha.

When Abraham's guests visit him, he acts as a servant, bowing to the ground in greeting. And rather than join them in the meal, he remains standing nearby – as a servant would – ready to see to their needs. And in that, it is Mary, rather than Martha, who is following Abraham's example. What are Jesus' needs? To be waited on, to be served? Far from it – Jesus himself came not to be served, but to serve. And part of his mission was to make disciples, who would learn from him and so spread his gospel among the nations. In sitting at the Lord's feet, Mary is in fact serving the Lord. She is doing precisely what he wants – listening to his message, letting it sink into her heart. She is assuming – literally and figuratively – the position of a disciple. Martha on the other hand, is too busy with her own ideas, her desire to be the perfect hostess – and she outs this first.

This story follows on immediately from the parable of the Good Samaritan, and in fact acts as a kind of commentary on it. The priest and the Levite, like Martha, were too busy with their own projects to be able to see what was really asked of them. Like the Samaritan, who put aside his own plans to help the injured man, Mary is able to see what is essential, what the moment demands. In so doing, she welcomed the Lord and was obedient – she sat and listened. Martha never heard. She was so preoccupied with what she thought was important, that she missed out on the experience herself of sitting at the Lord's feet, of being a disciple.



It is easy for us to berate ourselves for being busy Marthas rather than contemplative Marys. That would be a simplistic understanding of the readings. Superficially, what Martha did was exactly what Abraham did. The difference between them is not what they did, but their underlying intention. Martha was totally unable to set aside her own plans and ideas. Mary, on the other hand, was able to resist society's expectations of her role as a woman (serving, carrying, fetching), as well as Martha's complaints, because she was able to see that this was a moment of grace. Whether our lives are superficially more like Martha's or Mary's, what is important is our inner attitude. We need to learn to detach ourselves from our own preconceived ideas, our own plans and intentions – and the expectations of those around us too – in order to be free to do what the Lord wants. The heart of this story is obedience – meaning listening. We need an open heart, which is able to make space and time to hear the Lord – all the more so if this challenges us or goes against what we expect. It is that openness, that ability to listen, for which Mary is praised. She encounters the Lord at first hand. It is real, personal relationship. It is a lesson for us all.

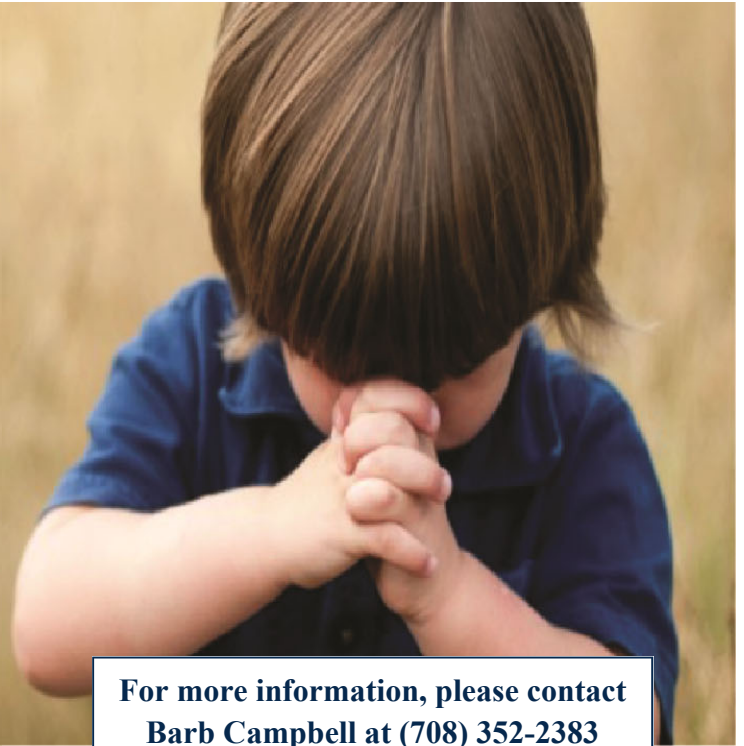

Jubilee Year of Mercy (December 8, 2015 – November 20, 2016)

JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY REFLECTION: SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Last Sunday's "Good Samaritan" parable concluded with Jesus' command: Go provide hands-on mercy to the next person you meet, no conditions, no limits, no exceptions. But today, Jesus seems to criticize Martha's hands-on mercy of hospitality, while praising Mary's "hands-off" as "choosing the better part" (Luke 10:42). Mary sat listening (10:39), leaving Martha "burdened with much serving by herself" (10:40). So, is the contemplative life of prayerful silence "superior," but the active life of earning a living, raising a family, running parishes, schools, hospitals, and social service ministries "second-class" discipleship? No; Jesus' example is not either/or but both/and: silent communion with God, boundless compassion for people. If we do not seek Jesus in silent prayer, how will we find Jesus in all others? If we do not serve Jesus in others, will our worship, despite its beauty, be anything but empty ritual? This *Jubilee Year of Mercy* offers us Jesus' two-fold challenge: both "go and do" and "sit and listen."

JUBILEE OF MERCY RESENT

How do we oppose the mercy of God? Certainly, that happens when we refuse to accept or share mercy. More subtly and perhaps more dangerously, it happens when we resent the forgiveness and the second chance that others receive. In doing so, we align ourselves with death, not new life. *"But we had to celebrate and rejoice, because this brother of yours was dead and has come to life; he was lost and has been found."* (Luke 15:32)

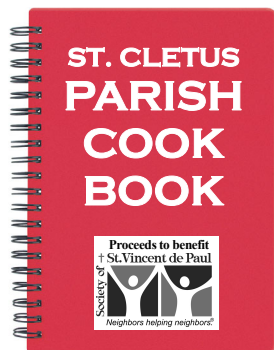

An eye for an eye makes the whole world blind. July 8, 2016

Again we begin our day shocked by news of lives lost overnight — this time those of five police officers working to ensure the people of Dallas could assemble in a peaceful anti-violence protest.

This latest tragedy comes directly after deaths in Louisiana and Minnesota. Every corner of our land is in the grip of terror fueled by anger, hatred and mental illness and made possible by plentiful, powerful weapons. Anyone at any time can become a victim. It is time to break the cycle of violence and retaliation, of fear and powerlessness that puts more guns in our homes and on our streets.

Our hearts and minds need to change so our country can change.

As Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. said, "Returning violence for violence multiplies violence, adding deeper darkness to a night already devoid of stars. Darkness cannot drive out darkness; only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that."

Let us assemble in love to embrace the mourning and lost among us.

Let us assemble in brotherhood to learn what unites us and put aside what divides us.

Let us assemble in strength and keep assembling until our leaders have the courage to take the actions that will make these tragedies less likely.

Let us pause today to remember not only these officers, but the principle of non-violence they died protecting.

And pledge, in their memory, to overcome hate and violence and work for peace today and every day.

Although summer is full swing, there is much to look forward to in the fall ! As plans take shape for the upcoming school year, consider joining Encounter. In the midst of busy schedules and heavy workloads, it can be even more important to take time to stop and reflect about God's role in your life and to share these experiences with others. Encounter small groups will meet monthly to take some time to reconnect with other teens from St. Cletus and to take a look at how life looks through the eyes of faith. ADULTS NEEDED : ENCOUNTER GROUPS

Are you interested in helping youth grow spiritually? Do you enjoy working with teens? I am looking for enthusiastic, dedicated, and faith-filled parishioners who are flexible and willing to give of their time and talent to minister to our teens in faith-sharing groups. Called Encounter, these groups will allow teens and adults to come together to encounter Christ by looking at their lives through the lens of faith. As a leader, you will share your home (or partner with someone who shares theirs) and share your faith eight times per year with a small group of teens. You will be invited to help at a few large group sessions as well. A few facilitator meetings are held

during the year to give you the support and guidance necessary to enjoy the many rewards of this ministry. This responsibility should be shared, and session outlines and curricula would be supplied. If you are considering making this commitment, please pray over it. We need you!

IGNITE : HIGH SCHOOL AND COLLEGE STUDENTS

Ignite is a student-led small group that meets one hour each week over the summer. Groups of college or high school



students reflect on a Scripture passage and how it is relevant to things we face every day. Many of us wonder how Jesus's teachings about things like sheep or fig trees could possibly help us understand our own daily struggles, and this is what Ignite groups talk about.

Ignite is open to all high school and college students who have completed at least one year of high school and will each Tuesday from 7:30-8 :30 pm in the parish center at St. John of the Cross. 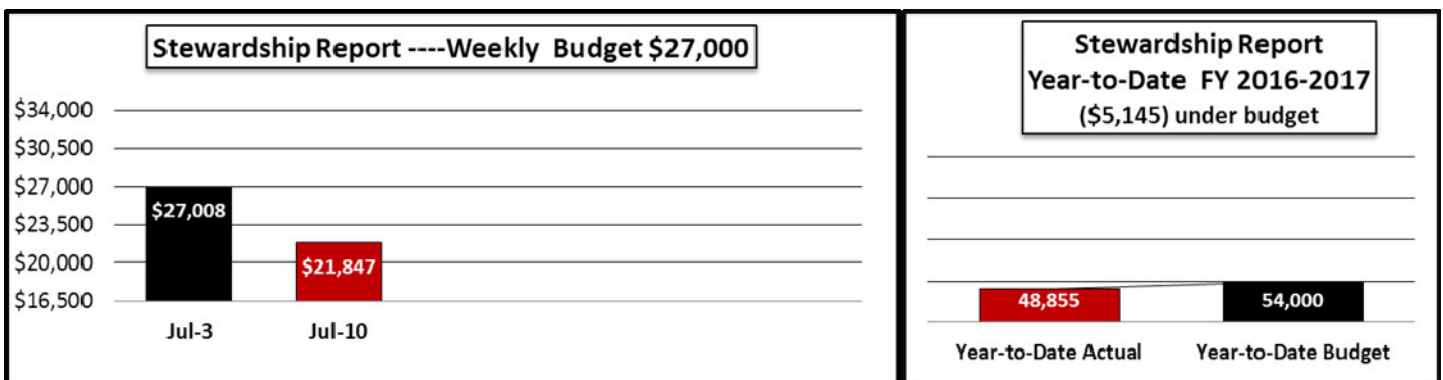
