

Pastor's Note

Dear Parishioners,

Last weekend we were blessed to welcome Fr. Michael Oluka from the Archdiocese of Tororo, Uganda, as our special guest. He diligently and joyfully preached and made himself available to talk with us after all Masses. He enjoyed the hospitality offered by the members of the Girls Scouts. He even took the time to write a letter thanking us for our warm hospitality. He is a man of God who delights in serving God and his people. I was encouraged by his priestly zeal and joy. I wholeheartedly take this opportunity to thank you for offering Fr. Oluka a warm and kind welcome to our parish and for your very generous contribution to the second collection last weekend.

With deep appreciation to your prayers and continued support, I am happy to share a few important updates with you.

First, Maria S. Reyna is the new Administrative Assistant of the office of Faith Formation for Children effective August 15th, 2022. She currently works at Salt Creek Elementary School in Elk Grove Village as the Resource Reading Assistant. She is also finishing up her Masters in Pastoral Studies at the Catholic Theological Union in Chicago. She previously has offered her talents and passion for ministry and evangelization at St. Stephen the Protomartyr Parish in Des Plaines and St. Jerome Parish in Chicago. She is fluent in English and Spanish. I am delighted to have her as part of our Faith Formation team. Please keep her and Lawrence Manetti in your prayers as they work together along with our generous catechists to offer our children sound faith formation as they grow in their relationship with the Lord.

Second, with the generosity and leadership of Kathy and Henry Morlock, our parish will be re-launching the Pre-Cana ministry in the fall. Kathy and Henry are longtime parishioners of St. Cletus. They love sharing their joy, time, and love for the Lord with others. Sometime after their wedding they were invited by a priest to consider becoming more active in their faith and relationship with the Lord by perhaps becoming leaders of a Pre-Cana ministry. After prayer and discernment, they accepted the invitation and made themselves available to receive formation and guidance. After successfully completing their formation, they have been accompanying engaged couples in their preparation for marriage for the past few years. During Covid they have been offering Pre-Cana online. I am grateful to Kathy and Henry for their openness and willingness to re-start Pre-Cana Ministry in person at our Parish. Please keep in your prayers Kathy and Henry and all the engaged couples they are going to walk with and encourage with their joy-filled faith and ministry.

Third, the progress of the installation of the new Sound/Streaming system for our church is slowly moving along. We have been in constant communication with the company with whom we have signed the contract. Last week we were informed that some equipment has already arrived. Unfortunately, some core pieces that are needed for the installation had to be backordered. We will continue to inquire and keep you informed. It is my hope to have the new Sound/Streaming system up and running by Christmas. Thank you for your trust and generous support with this project. Together we will pray, discern, and plan well our Sharing and Conversation we anticipate having in October. In advance, I want to thank you for making the decision to attend this important gathering where I hope we all will have an opportunity to offer our contribution as we continue to grow in our efforts to have a parish that is warm, caring, and welcoming.

Finally, I pray that as beloved daughters and sons of God we will continue to allow God to be part of our lives so that He can show us how to share our blessings generously with others.

Note From Father Novick

By the time you read this, we will have begun to listen to one of my absolute favorite letters/epistles in the New Testament, the Letter to the Hebrews. Maybe I was imagining things when I was a child, but I thought I would hear the lector proclaim, "A reading from the Letter of ST PAUL to the Hebrews," and maybe I did actually hear it, but at some point, that all stopped for me. Of course, I should have been paying more attention to the actual reading and not worried about who authored the writing.

As you can probably figure out for yourselves, the author of the Letter to the Hebrews isn't known. Some would say, "then why is it included in the Bible if they can't be sure who wrote it?" Obviously, there are many such books and letters in the Bible, and it's a good thing people much more attentive than I were deciding on which writings to keep. Some moons ago, the Second Vatican Council put forth a document *Dei Verbum* "THE DOGMATIC CONSTITUTION ON DIVINE REVELATION," which is exactly what it sounds like it ought to sound like – on the Word of God. The second paragraph Dei Verbum begins with a bold statement "In His goodness and wisdom God chose to reveal Himself and to make known to us the hidden purpose of His will..." (DV, 2) But what constituted how the various books of the Bible came to be included? Who decided what to include and exclude from the compilation we know today as Scripture?

I love the first sentence in paragraph 11 to give the best explanation to the question of HOW writings were included "Those divinely revealed realities which are contained and presented in Sacred Scripture have been committed to writing **under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit**." (DV, 11) While St. Jerome is responsible for translating the sacred texts, ultimately it is the Church who has always made the decision what writings to include and exclude under the direction of the same Holy Spirit. Like many, I've often wondered who those men were to make such crucial decisions regarding God's revelation to His people. I'm just glad they did it.

I'm still working on my homily for the weekend of the 6th and 7th of August as I write this article, so bear with me as one of the primary themes for this weekend is faith. That's what I really like about the reading from the Letter to the Hebrews. The author gives us the primary theme of the Letter in its first sentence – faith. "Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen." (Heb. 1:1) In that very sentence, the author sets up the story of Abraham – the primary figure in the Hebrew tradition as father of the covenant between God and man. So this author knew of the importance of the tradition and texts of his audience. But even at the early portion of the Letter, he introduces the Hebrews to teachings they might have only heard about in stories, but not as truths. He will begin to lay out some of our most fundamentals of things you and I sometimes take for granted – Jesus' natures as the Son of God and son of man, the Resurrection, the Eucharistic sacrifice in both Heaven and on earth, and so much more.

I invite you to read ahead in this fantastic Letter. There is some really solid theology happening. In fact, there are even a few good reasons for either you to be sure you are at Mass every week, or, you know of a friend or relative that has not been practicing for some time and explain to them what YOU learn. Who knows? Maybe they'll listen to you. Even the best reason for you to try is within the chapters of the great writing, but I will let you find that for yourself (even though you already KNOW the right answer). It just whets your appetite and curiosity for finding out what I am alluding to. Who knows? Maybe you'll find out just enough to peak your curiosity about other books of Scripture to do your own study? Or maybe, you are afraid that if you find out you like it, then you already have too many things on your plate. Well, what could be more important than learning about God through the Bible – from His Own Mouth?

Hello Parishioners of St. Cletus, I would like to take this opportunity to introduce myself. My name is Lawrence Manetti and I am very excited to have been given the opportunity by Father Elmer to be joining the staff of St. Cletus as the Director of Faith Formation for Children.



As a way of introduction I'd like to

share my background. Along with my credentials as an educational leader, I hold a Master Degree in Religious Education and my certification from the Archdiocese in Faith Formation.

The past two years I have been serving the St. Stephen Deacon & Martyr parish as the Faith Formation Director. Prior to my taking the position at St. Stephen I served as a principal in the Archdiocese of Chicago Schools retiring in June of 2020 from St. Joseph in Summit where I served for 24 years. The last three years in which I served as principal and D.R.E. working with our school and Religious Education families, particularly within our sacramental preparation.

I firmly believe parents are the first Catechists of their children. Hymnal News

New Hymnals/Worship Aids coming soon!

Earlier this year we were notified by the publishers of our bi-lingual Music Issue missals/hymnal that our current missals are no longer going to be produced. We solicited samples of potential replacement books from both GIA Publishing (the publishers of our current Gather Book) and OCP/Oregon Catholic Press (the publishers of the Music Issue booklets currently contained in our blue vinyl binders). Fr. Elmer, Tina Norton, Juanita Avila, Luis Galvez, and Karen Ziemba subsequently met to discuss the alternatives. After prayerful discussion it was decided that the United in Christ/Unidos en Cristo soft cover books, as well as new vinyl covers, would be ordered. The format will be slightly different from our old missals; the music edition will feature English and Spanish songs that are currently not available in the Gather books. 400 copies will arrive and be placed in the pews in late November, to coincide with the 1st week of Advent.

It was during the discussion regarding the missals that I brought to the attention of this committee the fact that our red Gather Comprehensive II books, which we have had since 2004 (18 years! They've served us well!) and which do not contain the new order of Mass/wording instituted in 2010, are terribly out of date and it would be a great addition to our parish if those hymnals could be replaced. The new Gather Fourth Edition, first published in 2021, contains all the new responses, many new and more contemporary songs, several updated Mass settings as well as still featuring the songs and responsorial psalms that are currently part of our parish repertoire.

To help defray some of the cost for the new Gather IV (Gray) books and accompanying materials, we are requesting you support this effort in the following way.

Each hymnal is valued at \$25. We are asking you to donate one or as many hymnals as you like. You can dedicate each hymnal you donate to the memory of a loved one or in honor of your family or friend(s). A bookplate will be placed on the inside front cover of the hymnal with this information. 




