

Notes from Fr. Bob...

FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Karl Rahner SJ, one of the great theologians of the last century, wrote many books in which he tried to make sense of the Catholic faith for his contemporaries. That's what a theologian has to do. Towards the end of his life he wrote an influential essay on the future of the Christian faith. It began with this provocative statement: "The Christian of the future will either be a 'mystic'...or...will cease to be anything at all."

Did he mean that we must all have visions like St. Teresa of Avila? Karl Rahner thought that the old Catholic culture that he had known as a boy was fast disappearing, eroded by an increasingly secular world. It meant that the average Christian could not depend on a Christian culture that everyone took for granted. So he thought that unless Christians had a deep and personal experience of God they would not be able to keep up the practice of their faith. That is all he meant by saying that each person needed to be a mystic. No matter how big the institutional Church seems to be, if its members do not have in them the life blood of a personal encounter with God, then it will wither away.

Jesus took for granted that his Jewish faith needed laws and institutions like the Temple if it was going to transmit its message to the next generation. And so he knew that his Church must be built on the rock of Peter; then God would preserve it from all its enemies. But in today's Gospel, he tells his disciples at the Last Supper that if they are to survive they must remain close to him. He takes the image of the vineyard, which was used to represent Israel in the Old Testament, and in a sense identifies himself with it by saying: I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser."

If the disciples are to survive then they must be branches of Jesus, the vine. And just as a vine is pruned to make it more fruitful, the disciples will also grow by being tested in their faith. Jesus tells them to remain close to him and have the living sap flowing in their branches, or else they will shrivel up. He insists that at the heart of their faith there is this close personal relationship with him: "Make your home in me, as I make mine in you." As they are united in Christ so they will be united through him to the Father. But this experience is not just for special members of the Church, like the apostles. The Spirit is given to everyone. All are called to have this "mystic" experience of being so close to Christ in their daily life that they produce good fruit.



essential to our faith. We cannot say, as some do, that we want Jesus but not the Church. In the Creed we affirm our belief in Jesus Christ and also in "one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church." The institutional Church is a key part of our faith, but there is always the danger of just going through the motions and dying on the vine. The institution will shrivel unless its members have the sap of the living Christ flowing through them.

As Karl Rahner pointed out, it is much more difficult now to be carried along by other people's faith in a society that is both secular and often hostile to our beliefs. How can we produce the fruit that will show that Christ's Church is alive and well? We do not need to be mystics like some of the great saints, but to make sure our practice of the faith, whether it is going to Mass or saying our prayers, is firmly based on a close personal relationship with Jesus. We don't at first have to do anything but rather to be at peace in his presence, to allow him to dwell in us. Then we can share a deep communion with him as we receive his body and blood in the Eucharist. If we change the image from sap, we could say that his real presence in his blood gives us new life. If we do have this close relationship of the branch to the "true vine," then it will produce good fruits especially in the way we love God and one another.

FOOD PANTRY UPDATES



Food Pantry

The past few weeks we shared with you some of the exciting changes coming to the food pantry. If you missed the previous updates check out recent Canticles on the St. Cletus website.

Technology

This month we began switching from our paper registration book to the online registration system Food Bank Manager (FBM), to track clients receiving food assistance. Some of the benefits include:

- Paperless system
- No need to re-register clients, no need for specific food pantry ID's
- Option to designate a proxy to pick up for a homebound client
- Tracks monthly reports for the Greater Chicago Food Depository
- Helps track which clients are eligible for SNAP benefits
- Records ages of children/adults in the household, used for Giving Tree
- Allows for multiple registration check in stations at once
- Easy to update contact information
- Automatically notifies the volunteer if client has already attended the pantry this
 month (clients are able to attend once a month. This can be overridden in the case
 of an emergency so the client can receive food again, if needed.)

As with any registration process it will take a little extra time to register each household into the new system. But once they return again they simply have to provide their name to check in. We use iPads for this system. Two of our iPads were provided for free through the Greater Chicago Food Depository (GCFD). Thank you to GCFD for the donation, to our IT Director Chris Wagner for his assistance, and to our awesome registration volunteers!

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

- 1 in 4 women will experience Domestic Violence.
- Statistically about 1,000 registered St. Cletus parishioners are impacted as abusers or victims of domestic violence.
- The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops says:

 - 'Husbands should love their wives as they love their own body, as Christ loves the Church."

- "No person is expected to stay in an abusive marriage."
- "We encourage abused persons who have divorced to investigate the possibility of seeking an annulment." (Emphasis added. USCCB "When I Call for Help")

LIVING BRANCHES

The Gospel and second reading for this Fifth Sunday of Easter emphasize the need for us to remain in Christ, and he in us. This shared life finds expression in the image of the one vine and many branches. We become living branches of the vine, members of the Body of Christ through baptism, Eucharist, and confirmation, sacraments of sharing God's own life. The First Letter of John describes the fruit of this vine as active love of neighbor: "And his commandment is this: we should believe . . . and love one another" (1 John 3:23).

Our first reading from Acts shows us an example of someone who shares in Christ's life in the person of Saint Paul. Paul's fearless witness, even at the risk of his life, is proof to everyone that the risen Lord's Spirit truly fills him with life and is bearing fruit in him.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION


In medieval times, one country, Scotland, linked its economy to the liturgy. Four holy days of the church calendar were keyed to the legal year. On these days, rents were due, clergy and servants were paid, and contracts and leases would begin or end. The term days were Pentecost (called Whitsunday), the Feast of Saint Martin on November 11 (Martinmas), the Feast of the Presentation on February 2 (Candlemas), and August 2 (Lammas), a harvest festival. On Lammas day, the first loaf of bread from the summer wheat harvest was given to the village priest. After the Reformation, which swept the Catholic festivals away, the term days were gradually detached from the old feasts. It was only in 1990 that the term days were anchored on the 28th of February, May, August, and November. Today the old Scottish universities are the last hold-outs, still naming their terms or semesters after the old festivals. Scottish students today may not know about the liturgical year, but they still call the fall term Martinmas, and the spring session Candlemas.



Our Chancel Choir sings regularly at the 9:30 a.m. mass; rehearsals are from 7:30 p.m. to 9:15 p.m. each Thursday. This group focuses more on traditional hymns and classic choral pieces.

Our Contemporary Choir sings approximately two times per month at the Saturday, 5:00 p.m. mass; rehearsals are held immediately prior to the mass at 4:00 p.m. with occasional additional rehearsals as needed. This group, with singers, drums and flute, focuses on a more contemporary sound.

Our Teen Choir sings approximately twice per month at the Saturday, 5:00 p.m. mass with an occasional appearance at the 11:00 a.m. mass on Sunday morning.

Our Youth Choirs....are open to all boys and girls, grades 3rd through 8th, attending either a public school or St. Cletus School. These choirs generally sing at the Sunday, 11:00 a.m. mass approximately one-two times per month and also participate with the other adult choirs in several special masses throughout the year.

Junior Choir is open to students in grades 5 through 8. Rehearsals are held on Monday, from 4- 5 p.m.

Children's Choir is open to students in grades 3 and 4. Rehearsals are held on Thursday, from 5:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.

Our Good Shepherd Choir is part of the St. Cletus Compassionate Care Ministry. This choir provides music for funerals, memorial services and the annual evening mass in November for those families, who have within the past year, experienced the loss of a loved one. This choir sings on an "as needed" basis, frequently on fairly short notice.


