Dear St. Cletus Family Members,

I am extremely pleased to announce the date and time of our Ground Breaking Ceremony for our New Parish Center. We will break ground on Saturday June 25, 2016 after the 5:00 p.m. Mass. I invite all to come witness this historic event in our parish life and celebrate this wonderful accomplishment as a faith community.

I have some additional good news to share with you. As you know we had explained previously that we were short of funds to fully complete the construction of the new parish center and would have to complete the building in phases. I have been working closely with the Archdiocese of Chicago, who has recently reopened the Diocesan Bank, to obtain a loan so that we would be able to complete the entire building. The great news is that our request for a loan to complete the new parish center HAS BEEN APPROVED. This means that once construction begins we can fully complete the building without interruption.

After the first of next year the plan will be for us to participate in the required Diocesan Capital Campaign entitled "To Teach Who Christ Is" This campaign was designed by the Archdiocese to support educational advancement within the Archdiocese for Schools, Religious Education, and other educational programs. The other part of this campaign is designed to support customized projects or needs within our own parish. This campaign is structured so that for every dollar pledged by the parishioners 60% will be set aside for our needs and 40% goes to support Archdiocesan educational advancement. St. Cletus will begin asking for individual pledges starting after the first of the year 2017. The main goal of "To Teach Who Christ Is" for St. Cletus parish will be to obtain funds to repay our loan from the Archdiocese and any additional finishings that may be needed for our New Parish Center.

I am eternally grateful for all those parishioners who have and continue to support our current campaign "Living our Faith, Building our Future" which is scheduled to be fully completed in December 2016 and we request that if at all possible your current pledge be fulfilled by that time.

It is a great day to be a St. Cletus Parishioner and we have much to celebrate. Once again, please join us on June 25, 2016 at the 5:00 p. m. Mass followed by ground breaking after Mass.



Jubilee Year of Mercy (December 8, 2015 – November 20, 2016)



JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY REFLECTION: ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

On today's Jubilee for Those Sick and Suffering Disabilities, Jesus encounters a woman who is "spiritually ill." She is thus "disabled" from participating in Israel's worshiping community or polite society. Bathing Jesus' feet with tears, drying them with unveiled hair, anointing them (Luke 7:38) risk Jesus' becoming "unclean." Yet his mercy welcomes even such inappropriate behavior as her sincere manifestation of love: "Your sins are forgiven. Go in peace" (7:48, 50). Go not just in "peace," but in shalom, the all-enveloping, life-changing assurance of God's mercy. She is anonymous, "known in the city" only as "a sinful woman" (7:37). The character with name and religious title, "Simon the Pharisee" (7:36, 40), judges her harshly, but himself not at all, and thus forfeits God's mercy. This Jubilee Year of Mercy challenges us to selfexamination. In which role do we most often cast ourselves, humble sinner or judgmental Pharisee? Jesus declares that only by an unfailing willingness to show mercy to fellow sinners can we hope to obtain mercy ourselves (see Misericordiae Vultus, 9).




