## Notes from Fr. Bob...

#### 2<sup>ND</sup> SUNDAY OF LENT


"Of course there must be lots of magic in the world," he said wisely one day. 'But people don't know what it is like or how to make it happen. Perhaps the beginning is just to say nice things are going to happen until you make them happen." In THE SECRET GARDEN by Frances Hodgson Burnett, this statement is made by Colin, a sickly child, whose recovery and increasing physical strength coincide with his discovery of the secret life in the secret garden. Through his experience he discovers his own inner life, which has the potential for spontaneity, joy and creativity that is unique to him.

Because of his illness Colin had been overprotected and he had never been able to experience the joys of childhood adventure and discovery. He had never learned to communicate his feelings. Helped by his lively friends to find the secret garden, Colin finds a lost part of himself and he exclaims, "The sun is shining, the sun is shining. That is magic. Being alive is magic, being strong is magic. The magic is in me, it's in me. It's in every one of us."

As we enter the second week of Lent we hear the story of Jesus' glorious transfiguration. It comes not long after Jesus has been telling the disciples that he is going to suffer and die, and that those who wish to be his disciples must let go of their own needs, take up their cross and follow him. The disciples are alarmed. It cannot have been easy to hear what their friend was telling them. Peter is quick to protest (after all, Peter probably wasn't too keen about the idea of dying on a cross). He tells Jesus that this cannot happen. Jesus rebukes him strongly.

But Jesus understands that his words must be difficult for his disciples to hear. And eight days later, Luke tells us, Jesus takes Peter, James and John to the top of a mountain, where he prays and they rest. In the course of his prayer the intimacy that Jesus shares with his Father is revealed. His face shines like the sun and his clothes become a dazzling white. The disciples are astounded, not least because they also see Jesus talking to Elijah and Moses.

Peter's immediate reaction is one of amazement, and he wants to hold on to the experience for ever. Despite his apparent naivety, the absolute truth that has been revealed is not lost on Peter. As if to bring the disciples back to earth, clouds suddenly appear and overshadow them. Then they hear the voice: "This is my Son, the Chosen One. Listen to him."



Maybe we have experienced such a moment in our lives: perhaps when we fell in love for the first time, or when our first child was born, or when we found ourselves surrounded by stunning countryside. These moments of awe and wonder are the consolation experiences that, though momentary, stay with us and help us when life gets tough. Peter's experience on the mountain may appear to be short-lived, but it is such a momentous experience that it becomes a part of him, so that when his life later becomes very difficult he is able to remain faithful to his discipleship, knowing that he has experienced the majesty of God.

For Colin, in the book, discovering the secret garden leads to his "transfiguration experience" – the discovery of his own inner beauty and strength. It so excites him that he wants to share it with everyone else, while at the same time it frees him to recognize the magic that is in everyone. Colin is right. Often, because of life's trials and difficulties, we can lose sight of the light within us. At our baptism we were given the light of Christ to share with the world, a world that really needs that light. Perhaps this Lent is a time for us to reflect on our inner beauty and to ask God to heal those areas that overshadow us and might prevent us from reflecting our light and Christ's light to the world.

On Sunday, March 17th our RCIA Catechumens (Carl Kash and Kelsey Thompson) and Candidates (Bruce Wulff, Shane Bonarek, Sal Montes, Kayla Tlaseca, Nisa Tlaseca, Kevin Villa and Jackie Villa) will be gathering together at the 11 a.m. Mass to publicly express their desire to become members of the Catholic Church through the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation, or to be in full communion with the Church with the celebration and reception of the sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation at the Easter Vigil. At Mass the Candidates will sign the Book of the Elect and be affirmed by their Godparents, Sponsors and our parish faith community. #### STAND FIRM IN THE LORD

It is not hard to imagine, in this age of wars, evil groups bent on the destruction of humanity, and political follies. that the words of Saint Paul were so accurate, even for his time. It seems that the world never changes. Paul says, "Many . . . conduct themselves as enemies of the cross of Christ. Their end is their destruction . . . Their minds are occupied with earthly things" (Philippians 3:18, 19). The result is the destruction of innocent people and of the Earth itself. But Paul says to the Philippians, "our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we also await a savior, the Lord Jesus Christ" (3:20). He will "change our lowly body to conform with his glorified body" (3:21). Note that he says "body" rather than "bodies." He is talking about the whole community of believers, who, following the example of Jesus and of Paul, will come into the glory of God. So "stand firm in the Lord" (4:1). God. #### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

By now, many may have failed in Lenten discipline to some measure or another: the daily doughnut is simply too alluring, or a furtive puff on a cigarette irresistible. There is meaning even in the failure, though, a kind of reminder that we cannot save ourselves. Part of the power of Lent is that we do it together, and although individuals decide on different ways to keep it, it is fundamentally the same journey. We fall, we get up, we keep moving. The desire to "give something up" for Lent is an age-old impulse in the Christian heart. We get better at it over the years, and move more deeply into the meaning and message of acts of sacrifice; so there is no shame in stumbling, as long as we are not discouraged by the failure and give up. We are clearing space in our lives. after all, and some of the things we desire to give up are worth rooting out completely anyway.

What do we do with the space we have cleared out by our sacrifice? The Lenten question of giving up is balanced by the Easter question of our response to Christ's embrace of us in love: "What are you taking on for Easter?"

#### **SCRIPTURE**

"And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors." Matthew 6:12

#### REFLECTION

A priest once told this story about his family. Two of his uncles were farmers in the community where he had grown up. At some point, the two uncles had a severe disagreement, and they refused to speak to each other. But, as it turned out, each uncle farmed land that was behind the home of the other. So each day they planted or harvested, they had to drive their tractors past one another. For 20 years, as they went to work in the morning and returned in the evening, they did not speak a single word to one another.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church is very clear in its interpretation of Matthew 6:12. God's "...outpouring of

mercy cannot penetrate our hearts as long as we have not forgiven those who have trespassed against us." (CCC 2840). No one of us can love the God we cannot see if we refuse to love the sister or brother we do see (1 John 4:20). Refusing to forgive leads inevitably to closing ourselves out of God's merciful love.

This season of Lent is again an opportune time to let the love of God break through any shell of our unforgiving nature. The disciplines of Lent help us to recognize the blindness in ourselves as we look out at the world and see people we dismiss, hate, or despise, either as individuals or as perceived enemies. It is an especially important time to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. When we confess our sins, God opens our hearts to God's grace.




