

Pastor's Note

"And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim," Acts 2:4.

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend with faith and gratitude we celebrate Pentecost. We are invited not only to recall the day the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples but also the moment the Holy Spirit was poured into our hearts at our Baptism and Confirmation.

What is the Holy Spirit? According to St. Paul, the Holy Spirit is the love of God poured into our hearts (Romans 5:5). In a sense, He is the Spirit of the Lord; He is the life of God himself, making his home in us. I encourage you to pray, reflect, and share with others the way St. Paul allows us to understand and experience the Holy Spirit at the level of the heart.

How is the Holy Spirit shaping our lives and the lives of those we love? How is the Holy Spirit guiding us in our lives? Note From Father Mike

Come, Holy Spirit

Holy Spirit, by whose breath, life rises vibrant out of death. classroom days. He was allowed to finish the program and Come to create, renew, inspire. Come kindle in our hearts he thrived. One thing I remember was him telling us that your fire."

The Church, as I stated last week in my homily, is in a state of constant change. The only constant in the Church is Jesus Christ as its head. So why is the Church always changing? Well, that first verse of the above song gives us that reason. "Come to create, RENEW, inspire." This is not a Renew My Church article, but it is simply my way of reminding you of "all that Jesus said and did before He was As the song verse says, the Holy Spirit inspires. taken up." (Acts 1:2) When something is NEW, it automatically denotes that something is changing. So, when we hear the word "renew," it ought to tell us that we are listening to Jesus again and trusting that He would send the Holy Spirit to be our guide. It is the Holy Spirit's role in the Trinity. He sanctifies – He blesses our souls with the ability to accept change -- to accept something new.

Within the last 15 years or so, I've heard many people from different parishes talk about just how much they love the Holy Spirit. I've told you in the past about how the Holy Spirit creatively called me to priestly ministry (after about 10 or so tries), and how I was called to be pastor at St. Lawrence O'Toole. I continue to see His hand in various ways around St. Cletus too.

Some 10 years ago, St. Lawrence O'Toole had a parish

mission given by two deacons from the Diocese of Atlanta (I honestly do not recall their names). They told us many There is a great church-hymn called *Veni*, *Creator Spiritus* stories about their lives before ministry. One of them was a ("O Holy Spirit, by whose breath"). The first verse is "O rather large man who I recall had had a stroke while in their while recovering from the stroke which primarily affected his speech, he was inspired to pray three simple words – over and over again "Jesus, Lord Jesus." He was not simply comforted by those words, but he also knew he was inspired to pray them because of the grace of the Holy Spirit. Beyond that, he would be inspired to take his message of healing on the road with his friend.

Many of you have been talking to me after masses and thanking me for the articles I've been writing recently. Like some would likely say, "thank the Holy Spirit." I don't tend to have articles on my brain that come pouring out of my head. I merely do my best not to let me get in the way of the Holy Spirit.

Last comment for the Holy Spirit for this week. There is a eucharistic revival going on around the nation. I hope everyone invested in the Church says thank you to the Holy Spirit for modeling and molding the Eucharist for His Church. Of course we know Jesus is totally cool. He IS in charge. But look and listen – If something is going to happen, then either the Holy Spirit will guide it, or the world will be likely to miss out on what God has in store for us.





Spring History Lesson

While this ministry is not usually involved with researching St. Cletus history, even though many of us have been around awhile and might know, a question was asked by an 8:00a Mass attendee while we were planting this past Tuesday.

While looking at the front of church and the newly planted flowers, I was asked if I knew what the symbols (letters) represented that are on the south facade of our church entrance. See attached photo. I did not know, but felt somewhat better when the parishioner who asked me said she could not get an answer from some priests. I had to do a little research. But thanks to St. Cletus staff members Chris Wagner and Jim Dion, I received a very quick response.

The letters represent an Eastern Orthodox necklace pendant and is in a medal-style. The letters are meant to be read from top to bottom, starting in the left column, below the horizontal arm of the cross. The letters are an abbreviation for "Jesus Christ Conquers." IC XC is Christogram abbreviation for Jesus and Christ and the right column, NIKA is Conquers. Therefore, Jesus Christ Conquers. We learn something new every day!


