**Jubilee Year of Mercy** (December 8, 2015 – November 20, 2016)

The official closing celebration of the Extraordinary Jubilee will occur during the 11:00 a.m. Mass, Sunday, Nov. 13th. After the last Mass on Sunday, the logo emblems and the garland marking the Holy door will be removed. Pope Francis will close the Holy Door of St. Peter's at the Vatican on the Feast of Christ the King, Nov. 20th.

As we close this Jubilee Year of Mercy we invite all to use prayer below:

### Prayer of Pope Francis for the Jubilee

Lord Jesus Christ,

you have taught us to be merciful like the heavenly Father, and have told us that whoever sees you sees Him. Show us your face and we will be saved.

Your loving gaze freed Zacchaeus and Matthew from being enslaved by money; the adulteress and Magdalene from seeking happiness only in created things; made Peter weep after his betrayal, and assured Paradise to the repentant thief. Let us hear, as if addressed to each one of us, the words that you spoke to the Samaritan woman: "If you knew the gift of God!"

You are the visible face of the invisible Father, of the God who manifests his power above all by forgiveness and mercy: let the Church be your visible face in the world, its Lord risen and glorified. You willed that your ministers would also be clothed in weakness in order that they may feel compassion for those in ignorance and error: let everyone who approaches them feel sought after, loved, and forgiven by God.

Send your Spirit and consecrate every one of us with His anointing, so that the Jubilee of Mercy may be a year of grace from the Lord, and your Church, with renewed enthusiasm, may bring good news to the poor, proclaim liberty to captives and the oppressed, and restore sight to the blind.

We ask this of you, Lord Jesus, through the intercession of Mary, Mother of Mercy; you who live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit for ever and ever.



### Domestic Abuse: The Epidemic No One is Talking About in Parishes

Domestic violence is a hidden epidemic that many clergy and laypersons are not properly trained to fight, says one priest who runs the country's largest parish-based ministry to counter the problem.

"When you start talking about it, that's when people will start coming forward," Fr. Chuck Dahm, O.P., who directs domestic violence outreach for the Archdiocese of Chicago, told CNA about the problem of domestic abuse.

The Church's hierarchy "has not been good in getting this into the training of clergy, deacons or priests," he said, even though a "beautiful" pastoral letter on the topic by the U.S. bishops, "When I Call for Help," exists.

"Most priests and bishops are unaware of it," he said. "And it should be taught and discussed in the seminaries, and it's not."

October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month. According to the CDC, "intimate partner violence" can be physical, sexual, or even emotional, as with instances of stalking or "psychological aggression."

27 percent of women in the U.S. have suffered intimate partner violence at some point, along with 12 percent of men, the CDC has reported.

There are many physical and psychological effects of domestic violence on victims – physical injuries and disabilities and bodily effects of stress, but also anxiety, depression, and trust issues. Children witnessing violence in the home may grow up with emotional problems like anger, or may even become abusers themselves when they are adults.

In his apostolic exhortation on the family, Amoris laetitia, Pope Francis wrote of the problem of domestic abuse:

"Unacceptable customs still need to be eliminated. I think particularly of the shameful ill-treatment to which women are sometimes subjected, domestic violence and various forms of enslavement which, rather than a show of masculine power, are craven acts of cowardice. The verbal, physical, and sexual violence that women endure in some marriages contradicts the very nature of the conjugal union."

He also insisted upon the need for parishes and priests to be ready to deal properly with these problems: "Good pastoral training is important 'especially in light of particular emergency situations arising from cases of domestic violence and sexual abuse'," he added, citing the final document from the 2015 Synod on the Family.



# JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY REFLECTION: 33RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



As this *Jubilee Year of Mercy* comes to an end, Jesus' first disciples ask what every age seems to wonder about the end of the world: "Teacher, when will this happen? What sign will there be?" (Luke 21:7). But instead of what we'd like to know, Jesus tells us what we need to know. Don't be terrified by natural disasters, human violence, personal sufferings. Because God's mercy

abounds, all is grace. "It will lead to your giving testimony" (21:13). So Malachi promises "the sun of justice with its healing rays" (Malachi 3:20a); and Jesus describes how we should welcome the end: "Stand erect and raise your heads, because your redemption is at hand" (Gospel Acclamation, Luke 21:28). Rather than worrying about ourselves and the future's perils, both Jesus' gospel and Pope Francis' *Jubilee Year of Mercy* bid us go forth to spend our lives proclaiming God's promise of boundless mercy, but also translating God's mercy into living deeds of unfailing compassion and enduring comfort.


