## Notes from Fr. Bob...

## THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER


At some point in your life you will have met someone really special. Perhaps it was a famous celebrity from film or television. Maybe it was a sportsman or woman renowned for their world records. It could even have been an old man who, in his seventies, jumped from a plane (with a parachute), bungee-jumped from a bridge in New Zealand and learned to scuba-dive in the Bahamas. Perhaps it was somebody a little more ordinary, a next-door neighbor or friend who made a huge impression upon you. They seemed to be so alive, generous and loving, that you found their company exciting and liberating.

When these meetings occur we try to make the moment last as long as possible. We find out as much as possible in case we will never get the chance to speak to them again. Then we always want to get back home or back to work and tell everybody all about it: "you'll never believe who I met this morning when I took the dog out!" Usually people will be interested for a little while but if we go on a little too long about this marvelous encounter our friends and family will soon begin to get bored. They may eventually try to change the subject altogether.

It is important for us to understand how others can be so disinterested in this remarkable encounter. "Why don't you get it? This is amazing and you don't seem too interested at all! If only you could have been with me when I met so-and-so you would be excited too!"

The disciples are huddled in the upper room and have been listening to the two disciples who met Jesus on the road to Emmaus. The lives of these two disciples were turned upside down by their meeting with the Risen Lord and they wanted the other disciples to hear all about it. What were the feelings in the room at that moment? Perhaps some were jealous that it wasn't they who had met Jesus on the way to Emmaus. Maybe a few were still sitting in stunned disbelief – "Can this be true?" There might even have been a few who believed that what the disciples had told them was true, but were angry because they didn't know how they could meet Jesus.

Immediately after the telling of their story Jesus himself appears in the room. He interrupts all their solitary musings and the tender emotions of that moment and wakes everybody up with his presence. Some are still slow to understand what is going on — "Is it a ghost? How do I get out of here?" But Jesus reassures them, "It is I." And he gives them his peace. He is the same Master they had known but he is changed and glorified.



the hearts of the disciples. However, the telling of their story could not substitute for the other disciples' own meeting with the Risen Lord. They no longer need to speak about the peace of the Risen Lord for all the disciples now experience it for themselves.

Each of us is called to share the Good News of the Risen Lord. A vital part of that sharing is the telling of our own experiences of God and God's saving love for us. Yet, it is vital for us to remember that, powerful though our sharing may be, it can never truly bring someone else to faith. Only a personal meeting, an encounter, with the Risen Lord can truly bring the peace that the world cannot bring. We are bearers of Good News but it is the Lord himself who will bring the word we share to fruition.

As servants of the word we share the Good News freely, but we do not assume responsibility for everything that happens afterwards. Perhaps someone may be resistant at first to the knowledge of God's love for them; perhaps they may even be hostile because of some past hurt. Whatever the situation, we simply share our trust in Jesus and pray that, in the fullness of time, the person may come to a personal knowledge of God for himself or herself.

The Emmaus disciples told their story and prepared the other disciples for the appearing of the Risen Lord. Let us be bold and generous in sharing the Good News we have received. Let us also be gentle, trusting that the Lord's desire for these people to draw near to him is much stronger and more influential than our meager words.




## Support St. Cletus School on April 17th at McDs

## FOOD PANTRY UPDATES

The past few weeks we shared with you some of the exciting changes coming to the food pantry in May. We will spend the next few weeks breaking down each of these areas to share





more details about where we are heading. If you missed the previous updates check out recent Canticles on the St. Cletus website.

## **Supermarket Model**

There are many ways to offer Client Choice at a food pantry distribution. We have chosen to use the Supermarket Model. This means that the food is set up on shelves by food groups. Clients walk through the space and take food off shelves according to the pantry guidelines (ex: 1 box of cereal, choice of 3 types of produce, etc.). This model allows clients to handle food and look at the labels just as if they were shopping in a store. This model is the most client-friendly. This does mean it will take a little while to select items, just as it takes each of us a little while to pick out our groceries at the store. We will help honor the client's ability to choose while also managing the flow of the space for everyone. Volunteers will help clients through the process to let them know how much is available, to help carry items, and answer any questions they may have.

## Variety of Items

When distribution was in the Church Narthex we were unable to offer refrigerated/ frozen items because they could not be kept temperature safe. With this new space we will be able to offer meat, milk, and other cold/frozen perishable items with our new refrigerators and freezers. For the past few years we have had an onsite garden with 10 raised beds. With the increased space and distribution schedule we will be able to get our homegrown, organic, local produce to the clients more often so less food goes to waste.

## **Third Sunday of Easter**

## **BELIEVING IN JESUS CHRIST**

Throughout the Easter season, all three of the Sunday readings are taken from the New Testament—the Christian scriptures. Together they explore what it means to believe in Jesus as the Christ, the One who fulfilled the prophecies of the Jewish scriptures.

Today's selections refer to our human weakness, yet they emphasize the forgiveness and peace that are available to those who put their faith in "Jesus Christ the righteous one" (1 John 2:2). In the Acts of the Apostles, Peter invites everyone to "repent, therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be wiped away" (Acts 3:19). The First Letter of John calls Jesus Christ "expiation for our sins" (1 John 2:2). Finally, in the Gospel Jesus greets the disciples with "Peace" and urges them to preach "repentance, for the forgiveness of sins" (Luke 24:47).



## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

There are many ways in which religious communities are organized. Some have a central authority in a congregation, and others have a "rule" that is shared by all the members, but are a kind of federation of independent houses. Sometimes, congregations with distinct histories and ministries decide to merge. Several years ago, one of the largest mergers on record took place. Seven independent congregations of Dominican women religious, most in the Midwest, are now one new congregation enfolding more than seven hundred members spanning thirty-six states. The oldest of the founding groups, the so-called "Kentucky Dominicans," began as a frontier community in 1822. Other communities have European roots. To get to this historic moment, the sisters spent many years in conversation, and approved the new structure by a two-thirds majority vote. This was then ratified by the Holy See. The merger allows the sisters to pool their resources in order to be more effective in ministry. They are living the Paschal Mystery, experiencing Christ's dying and rising in an inspiring way. -Rev. 
