
UPDATE TO IN-PERSON OFFERINGS

Notes from Fr. Bob...

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Patrick Kavanagh writes, in a poem entitled Advent, "We have tested and tasted too much, lover. Through a chink too wide there comes in no wonder." His message is that people become tired and surfeited with sensations. For him, Advent is a time of rediscovering wonder: the joy of a bright, crisp wintry morning, smell of food cooking, the look of surprise on the face of a small child exploring a new world, a glimpse of love or thankfulness for a gift. It is a time to pay attention to the particular, to the present moment.

The people to whom Isaiah writes have tested and tasted too much. Their hearts have strayed from God and this has led to a sense of lifelessness which is described in terms of being unclean or wearing filthy clothing. There is no joy to life. They experience the absence of God in their hearts. Yet they know that he is the potter who molds their destiny. Isaiah wants them to see again how God is active in everyday events.

Wakefulness characterizes the life of the disciple. He reflects on how God is active. To be aware of the giftedness of each person requires eyes to see and ears to hear. The disciple is invited to stand alert, like the watchman waiting for dawn, and to recognize God's power and love breaking in.

Paul is aware of this grace as he observes the witness of the Christians in Corinth. He is able to see the giftedness of the members of the community and recognizes the charisms of the Spirit that they possess. His love for Christ gives him the eyes to see and the ears to hear. He has the alertness of the disciple.

This particular Advent is a season of joy as we celebrate over two thousand years of Christianity. That the small group of disciples who fled from the cross is being remembered over two thousand years later is a true miracle. It bears witness to the Spirit poured over the Church at Pentecost. Recognizing the power of Christ in the Church, in good help us approach this season with new eyes and ears. How is God revealed in the cycle of nature? How do other people reveal God's love for me? Moments of tenderness, of intimate love, of forgiveness are



Silence in the midst of activity is a characteristic of the saints throughout the ages. The example of St. Benedict and his followers for fifteen centuries bears witness to the importance of such silence. How is this to be found in the midst of the busy Christian family? With difficulty, perhaps. But the human heart needs moments of silence to renew it. Times of prayer help deepen the awareness of God and God's work.

Gratitude is the mark of the disciple. May this holy season be a time of growth in gratitude for the faith handed on to each one of us.





Sources of Parish Operating Funds Fiscal Year 2020 \$1,893,185




Uses of Parish Operating Funds Fiscal Year 2020 \$1,916,351




Sources and Uses of School Operating Funds

Stewardship of Treasure

Summary of the Parish Financial Report Year Ended June 30, 2020

- Everyone's daily lives have been impacted by the COVID 19 virus, as we continue to pray for the world; we
 all adapted to keep each other safe. Last March, COVID-19 caused cancellations and limitations of daily
 and weekend masses as well as parish and school events. Virtual has replaced in-person liturgies, prayer
 opportunities and in-school learning, but technology has allowed us to still be connected. Your patience,
 volunteering and your continued support are greatly appreciated. Thank you.
- The combined Sunday; Christmas and Easter collections for the year decreased by \$76,155 from the prior year. The four month closure attributed to the decrease. The increased participation of the online giving option along with the mail-in contributions have helped tremendously to keep the decrease from being even higher. Thank you for your continued generosity
- The Fall Fest/Carnival was a huge success netting a profit of over \$101,000 for the parish and the school. Featuring entertainment, food, rides and raffles, this was a great event where the community can gather. Volunteers help to make this so successful. The Fall Fest will return in 2021.
- Parish family participation contributed \$173,527 toward school fundraising revenue in 2020. The school
 hosted a successful Virtual Spring Auction, raising over \$72,000. The remaining funds are from the
 Cardinal Raffle, Dance-a-thon, shop with scrip, Fall Fest and Annual Fund. The school also received
 \$22,110 in miscellaneous donations and grants from Loyola University and Aimsweb. Thank you for your
 participation and support.
- The required parish support to the school in fiscal year 2020 was \$272,569, due to decreased enrollment and increased tuition assistance, and a 3-5% rise in salaries and benefit costs.
- The parish finished the June 30, 2020 fiscal year with an operating loss (the shaded line of the Statement of Revenue and Expense) of \$23,166.
- In June of 2017 the original loan amount for the Parish Center was \$788,189, thanks to your continued generous pledge commitments and donations, the parish has since paid \$660,985 toward the principal balance, of which \$122,432 has been paid this year. An outstanding balance of \$127,204 remains as of June 30, 2020. The building provides a wonderful space for the children as well as the adults to utilize for worship, school, religious education, sports, and social gatherings. We are very close to paying the loan balance, we hope we can still count on your support, thank you in advance.
- The Parish's investment accounts had a net unrealized gain of \$3,062. The school's investment account had a net unrealized loss of \$5,164. Because investment gains and losses are not part of the parish's/school's normal operations, they are not considered in determining the parish's/school's operating income but rather considered Other Revenue.



Sunday Notes



MARK'S JESUS

Mark's Gospel is the shortest and tersest of all four. The discourses of Jesus tend to be terser as well. Mark's portrayal of Jesus has none of the poetry of the Sermon on the Mount or the Sermon on the Plain as in Matthew or Luke, nor the extensive, reflective "I Am" discourses as in John. Mark's Jesus "cuts to the chase," we would say today. This is reflected quite well in today's passage.

It is no accident that the dialogue of Jesus at this point in the Gospel according to Mark—the concluding words about the end of the world—immediately before his passion, is riddled with exclamation points and an overall sense of urgency.

We would do well to re-tool our own way of living this Advent, for we live in a world urgently in need of hearing the message of Jesus proclaimed. It's time for us to "wake up!" and get out into the world to do it.

What Is the Mass?

What is the Mass? There is no simple answer to that question. The Church uses many different images and terms to describe our most important prayer. The Mass is the celebration of the Eucharist, a Greek word that means "thanksgiving." It is the Lord's Supper. It is the Breaking of the Bread. It is the memorial of the Lord's passion, death, and resurrection. It is the Holy Sacrifice, in which the sacrifice of Christ on the cross is perpetuated. It is the holy and divine liturgy, the sacred mysteries. It is the source and summit of our Christian lives, the new covenant, the work of the Holy Spirit, the paschal mystery. The many different words and images that we use when we speak of the Mass are not signs of confusion, but of wonder at what the Catechism of the Catholic Church (1328) calls the "inexhaustible richness" of the Eucharist. The Mass, our greatest prayer and our deepest mystery, is celebrated every day, many times a day, the world over. The Eucharist is both "bread from heaven" and "daily bread." 


