

Dear Parishioners,

The courage of Peter and the apostles is worth reflecting upon and praying with. As we live and practice our faith in our society, we often encounter resistance and rejection. It seems like more of our fellow human beings are being led away from faith and God. Who knows what the world will look like in 50 or 100 years from now? But perhaps our fellow brothers and sisters and the world need more people like Peter and the Apostles who can gently draw them to Jesus. What do you think?

Last Saturday (4/23) the weather got warmer. It is my hope that the weather will continue to warm up so that we can enjoy spring and welcome summer. Spring is such a wonderful time of the year. Everywhere I look, I am already seeing trees, plants, grass, and so forth starting to come back, including some of the annuals we have in our parish grounds. I think with the care they will receive from us; they will look gorgeous.

I am so glad that our parish now has a new ministry called: *St. Cletus Fiacre Society*. This was announced last weekend through our parish bulletin (Page 11). The members of this society, following the witness of their patron saint, will dedicate themselves to the care of our parish gardens and grow in friendship with one another. On Friday, April 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2022, after the 8:00 AM Mass, 7 members of the society held its first event. I saw them with gloves, buckets, and other gardening tools that helped them to accomplish their goals for the day. I was moved by their dedication and love for gardening. I plan on joining them as much as I can. Please feel free to join them whenever you are able. I am grateful to Mary Delaney and Tom Reisel for leading us with this noble ministry. Let us all pray and ask the Lord for the success of this new ministry at our parish.

Over a month ago, Jim Dion, Business Manager, brought to my attention that a condensate tank and a pump located in the school building needed to be replaced as soon as possible. After proper consultation, Jim and I made the decision to welcome the help of David Kuznetzow, to whom I offer heartfelt gratitude. I am also grateful to Derek Sawicki for helping us with the completion of this project. For more details about this project, below I share with you a report I received from Jim.

A couple of weeks ago, the condensate tank and pump assembly under the Preschool wing of the school began to fail. The pump was making loud noises, overheating, then shutting off. This caused the condensate tank to fill up and overflow through the relief valve. A contractor we have worked with before was called in to look at the problem. In addition to the failing pump, the technician found that the tank was leaking, causing the chemically treated water to be wasted. They proposed to replace the tank and pump for \$7000.

Condensate pumps are a type of centrifugal pump that is used to collect and disperse the hot water and liquid produced by condensation from heating systems

Designed to run intermittently, condensate pumps include a collection tank where condensate (captured condensed liquid) can accumulate. When the liquid in the tank reaches a designated level a float switch activates the pump. The condensate is then pumped out of the tank until the level of liquid leaves room for more condensate collection. Some pumps contain a two-stage switch. As liquid rises to the designated first stage, the pump is activated. If the liquid continues to rise, because the pump has failed or discharge is blocked, a second stage is engaged where the pump may be shut off or an alarm triggered.

A local contractor, David Kuznetzow, the owner and operator of Interior Temperature Control, Inc. was consulted. Fr. Elmer had met David while on a communion call to David's mother-in-law. While David noted that he worked primarily on residential systems and not commercial systems, he offered to obtain a replacement pump and tank for the parish, at cost, for \$2500, which he did the following day. Derek Sawicki, our head maintenance engineer, was confident that he could replace the unit himself, completing the removal and replacement of the old tank and pump on Friday, March 25. The total cost to replace the unit was under \$3000, saving the parish a little more than \$4000. Without the help of David and the expertise of Derek, St. Cletus Parish would have needed to pay the full cost to perform this repair. Thank you, David, and Derek, for going above and beyond to help St. Cletus Parish!

Every day, week, and month I continue to experience the heart and courage of Peter and the Apostles through your actions, care, concern, and prayers for which I am most grateful. I pray that our Lord continues to bless our efforts and strengthen our relationship with Him so that we can continue to give good witness.



### GOD'S OVERFLOWING KINDNESS

The superabundance of God's kindness ties all of today's readings together. Especially when life overwhelms us, the Lord provides all we need, and then some. In the Acts of the Apostles, Peter takes the lead when facing the Sanhedrin. We might expect the man who denied Jesus to crumble under the imposing glare of the high priest. Instead, the Holy Spirit helps him testify to his faith in Jesus Christ. What Peter had lacked before, courage and conviction, God provides in abundance. Similarly, today's Gospel shows Jesus providing a surplus of fish for the disciples. They have no luck fishing until the Lord intercedes. Jesus supplies an almost ridiculous number of fish, and he cooks it for them, too. As our reading from Revelation affirms, the overflowing riches of God require constant praise. The first training sessions are this week, May 3 and 5. All servers, regardless of whether they served before, must take this training.



### **ST. CLETUS FIACRE SOCIETY**



We are announcing a new ministry at St. Cletus, the St. Cletus Fiacre Society. Never heard of this 7<sup>th</sup> Century Irish Monk, the patron Saint of Gardeners (also the patron Saint of taxi drivers!)? Neither had we until we started doing a little research and he seems like a good sponsor for this new ministry.

His legend is this: Fiacre asked the local bishop for more ground on which to plant

food and herbs. The bishop told him he could have as much land as he could entrench in one day. After prayer, Fiacre used the point of his staff to turn the earth, topple trees and dig up briers and weeds to prepare the land for a garden. A suspicious local woman was convinced that such a feat could only be performed by sorcery but the bishop viewed Fiacre's act as a gift from God and proclaimed it a miracle. Supposedly, the woman's jealousy caused Fiacre to implement a ban on women from his monastery. Thankfully, the St. Cletus Fiacre Society is more enlightened and has no such ban on women!

As word of Fiacre's miracle spread, visitors to Fiacre's Garden brought seeds and plants from afar, and his gardens became famous throughout Europe. The Catholic Church considers Fiacre the saint of growing food and plants used in medicine. After his death in 670 A.D., people who visited his monastery claimed that it had healing power. Fiacre is depicted in art and statuary as an elderly man carrying a spade (see above). While we as yet do not promote our campus grounds and flowers as providing any healing power, we do believe that our efforts to beautify our campus with flowers can invoke hospitality, welcoming all to our beautiful church and grounds.






